The Archives of the Ocean Beach Historical Society were founded to preserve the history of Ocean Beach and the peninsula. The Archives Room is housed in space rented from the PLUM Church in OB, where the Society's monthly meetings are held. The collection has grown to include: Photographs, maps, books, papers, newspapers, letters & artifacts. Also, there is an extensive biography index and San Diego City Directories from 1926 to 1984 which lists people, their spouses & occupations. Residents are also listed by street address.

Dedicated volunteers assist with the processing. Most of the Archives collection was donated and the majority of it has been cataloged, although work is ongoing. OBHS is working on digitally preserving taped historical presentions/interviews and continuing to develop our website www.obhistory.wordpress.com. We will be offering more in time.

There are no regular open hours. After an introduction to the collection, visitors are encouraged to do their own research or they may be referred to a professional researcher.

An excellent introduction to any research is
Ruth Held's book *Beach Town*—Early Days in Ocean Beach (to 1930).
Copies are available from the Society, online or at the public library.
Ruth Held was a founder of the Ocean Beach Historical Society and a meticulous researcher.

DONATIONS TO THE ARCHIVES ARE ALWAYS WELCOME.

Many people think that their lives are of no interest to others and frequently photographs, house plans, business and organization records and family papers end up in the trash, after a death in the family.

These items can provide an invaluable window into life in OB at a certain time. Photographs especially depict people, their activities,

pastimes, dress, homes and buildings. Some buildings in Ocean Beach vanish almost overnight and new ones appear. Functions in buildings change. The cliffs erode and the scenery changes. Ocean Beach residents and others in the future will want to know about all of that.

Unfortunately, we receive a number of unidentified, undated photographs, even from the *OB Exposed!* Photo Show.

PLEASE if you are donating photographs to the Archives, remember to date them and identify the people and places in them Your descendants and the OBHS will be thankful.

Reluctant to give up your photos or papers?

The Archives would be happy to copy and safely return items to you, with your permission to use the materials.

Preservation work often needs support and supplies. Storage boxes and enclosures are expensive. An example is a charming model of Wonderland created by Ocean Beach Elementary School students that needs loving restoration and a permanent made-to-measure cover (acrylic?) researched and purchased.

I will be talking about exploration of Sunset Cliffs and the remains of Albert Spaulding's Esplanade, caves and staircases, the ruins of the Theosophical Society, U.S. Army Fort Rosecrans bunkers and trenches, a wrecked Mexican fishing boat at the foot of Hill Street, mischief and hijinx in the hills, and fond memories of Ocean Beach water sports at

the Flood Control Channel.

In 1981, Ron lead a team of archaeologists in the discovery of a lost 18th century Spanish fort on the Naval Submarine Base on Point Loma and have been working out there on weekends for the past 30-years.
