

## **ANGELS** 7 O'CLOCK SAN DIEGO'S **PIONEER FEMALE AVIATORS**

by California State Parks Historian ALEX D. BEVIL Thurs., Aug. 16th, at 7 PM

an Diego has played an important role in American aviation history. Indeed, some of the Dearliest attempts at controlled flight have occurring here. While most historians recognize the pioneering work of Montgomery, Curtis, Ryan, and Lindberg, most ignored the role women played in San Diego's aviation history.

Alex's program, Angels at 7 o' clock, will focus on the untold story of San Diego's female aviators within the broader context of the history of women's aviation. Faced with gender bias, ridicule, and sometimes even outright sabotage, these "First Ladies of Flight," whether they realized it or not, were pioneer feminists. All possessed a single-mined determination to fly, often paying the ultimate price for their efforts. Ironically, Alex's presentation will be held less than two miles from the forgotten crash site of one of these brave women, whose crashed aircraft was described coldly as "a pile of lumber."

Alex Bevil is past-recipient of the Congress of History's prestigious Ben Dixon Award, California State Parks Historian. Alex is deathly afraid of flying. As part of his therapy, he has been involved in researching and documenting historic aviation-related crash sites in several California State Parks. His article about a 1922 airplane crash in San Diego's mountainous backcountry received the James S. Copley Library Award in 2005. Last year he successfully nominated a World War II-era bomber crash site near March Field, in Riverside County on to the California Register—the first of its kind listed in California.
