

REMEMBERING LOVERNE BROWN-

O. B. POET, ACTIVIST. **BELOVED** FRIEND Thurs., July 19th, at 7 PM

P.L. United Methodist Church, 1984 Sunset Cliffs Blvd., O.B.



During her half-century in O. B. (1950-2000), LoVerne was active in the community in many ways, especially following her retirement in 1974. She was co-founder of the Ocean Beach Community School in 1976 (as well as the school's poetry teacher); a longtime member and officer of the O.B. Friends of the Library and the O.B. -Point Loma chapter of the National League of American Penwomen; founder of the Ocean Beach Poetry Circle, which for years published the annual anthology "Zip Code 92107"; and a founding member of the Ocean Beach Historical Society. She was known for her generous spirit, her inclusive nature, and her unconditional love for her fellow human beings. A lifelong Democrat, she was active on the political scene and supported numerous social justice causes, especially those that benefited the homeless and victims of abuse.

By the late 1970s LoVerne, who was getting her second wind as a writer, especially as a poet, began responding to requests to do poetry readings throughout the city. And when it comes to community schools, LoVerne literally wrote the book on it. With coauthors Katie Elsbree and Denny Doyle, she penned The Grass Roots Alternative: A Citizens' Approach to Community Education, a 1977 publication based largely on the authors' experiences in founding the Ocean Beach Community School a year earlier. In 1999, 87-year-old, LoVerne Brown was honored with the Local Author Lifetime Achievement Award (LOLA), an annual award given by the San Diego Public Library to a local author for his or her body of work.

> **Pre-O.B.**— Loverne was born in North Dakota in 1912, her childhood years were spent in Alaska (still a territory) and the northern woods of Wisconsin. Following high school in Kingsburg, CA, college at UC Berkeley, and a stint as a newspaper reporter in Juneau, AK., LoVerne married a fellow reporter, and then made her way back to CA. She ghostwrote two books— No Life for a Lady and Consultation *Room*—both won national awards. She frequently wrote humorous poems about her children, which she sold to magazines such as the Saturday Evening Post and The Ladies Home Journal.

In 1950, Loverne's husband, George Brown (employed by the fed. gov.) was transferred to San Diego. They and their children-Tony, Jonnie, and Tim chose beautiful O.B. as their new home. Sadly in 1952, George died of a heart attack, and LoVerne became the family breadwinner, working for the next 22 years in the City of San Diego Engineering Dept. Her kids grew up settling in other parts of San Diego and CA., but LoVerne never left her beloved O.B.

Unfortunately, photographs, house plans, business & organization records, and family papers end up in the trash after a death in the family. The cliffs erode and scenery changes. The OBHS Archives provide an invaluable window into OB's past.
