Step back in time with Jim Bregante's historical presentation of San Diego's Waterfront and Little Italy.



continued from page 1— **Richard L. Carrico**, who spent his formative years in Ocean Beach, is a resident of Spring Valley where he spends a fair amount of his time doing research, writing, and making wine. He is a lecturer in the Department of American Indian Studies at SDSU and an adjunct professor in the Behavioral Sciences Department at San Diego Mesa and City Colleges where he teaches anthropology. Richard is also a principal in the firm Recuerdos Research where he serves as a consultant to local Indian tribes, government agencies, and private firms. He has a Master's Degree from the University of San Diego in History and B. A. degrees from San Diego State University in both History and Anthropology

His primary area of research is the Indians of California and northern Mexico. In addition to more than 30 publications in professional journals, Richard is the author of the recently released Images of America Series: Ramona and other books including Strangers in a Stolen Land: The Indians of San Diego County from Prehistory to the New Deal; San Diego's Ghosts and Hauntings; and History of the Wineries of San Diego County. He also has authored stand alone chapters in four academic books. He is pleased and greatly complemented to be invited back to the OBHS lecture series.


