



Thursday, March 19, at 7 pm

at P.L. United Methodist Church at 1984 Sunset Cliffs Blvd., O.B. argaret Francis is a WWII Veteran of the WRENS (Women's Royal Navy Service) **IV** in England. She worked on the decoding machines (the bombe) 10 miles from

Bletchley Hall at Gayhurst Manor.

Margaret will talk about her experiences bringing history to life. She is an excellent storyteller remembering with vivid details some of her experiences. She is 91 years old and has lived in San Diego since the 1957. Come join Margaret as she documents her experience as an important part of WWII history. This program is FREE!

THE HISTORY OF FAMOSA SLOUGH Featuring Jim Peugh, Thursday, April 16, at 7 pm

at the P.L. United Methodist Church at 1984 Sunset Cliffs Blvd., Presenter Jim Peugh, Chair of Board of Directors of Friends of Famosa Slough, will give the history of Famosa Slough that runs from being an ice age coastal canvon, a part of the estuary of the San Diego River, a dump for construction rubble, a planned construction site, to a City-owned urban wildlife preserve and hot spot for bird watching and nature study.

We will briefly discuss the successful campaign to get the City to buy it for conservation in 1990. Also the restoration that has occurred, the current uses by people & wildlife, including endangered Ridgway's Rails and California Least Terns.

Famosa Slough is owned by the City of San Diego as a Wetland Preserve. It is a part of the City's Multiple Habitats Protection Area for the protection of at-risk, threatened, and Endangered Species. It has also been identified as a No-Take Marine Conservation Area under the State of California's Marine Life Protection Act. And it is a nice place to watch, hear, and study coastal wetlands. The Friends of Famosa Slough partner with the City to help manage and improve its value for wildlife and for visitors. 

THE OBHS ARCHIVES WAS FOUNDED TO PRESERVE THE HISTORY OF OCEAN BEACH AND THE PENINSULA. The Archives Room is in the PLUM Church in O.B., where the OBHS programs are held.

The collection includes: Photos, maps, books, papers, newspapers, letters artifacts and an extensive biography index and San Diego City Directories from 1926 to 1984 (which list people, their spouses & occupations). Residents are also listed by street 904 Cottage address. Dedicated volunteers assist w/ processing.

DONATIONS TO THE ARCHIVES ARE WELCOME. Many people believe that their lives are of no interest to others, but they are!

Unfortunately, photographs, house plans, business & organization records, and family papers end up in the trash after a death in the family... photographs depicting people, their activities & customs, homes & buildings, and dress. Some O.B. buildings vanish or functions change almost overnight and new ones appear. The cliffs erode and scenery changes. The OBHS Archives provide an invaluable window into O.B.'s past.

Reluctant to give up your photos or papers? The Archive's staff would be happy to copy and safely return items to you with your permission to use the materials.
