Ome older Point Loma and Ocean Beach residents may remember the odd buildings which once sat in The middle of Collier Park west. The buildings, which were part of the Salvation Army's Door of Hope, included a dormitory style home for pregnant unwed mothers, a nursing facility, and the Collier Park Hospital. Collier Park west is still there, but it has been divided into a small park for picnics, a community garden, and a native plant oasis. An apartment development has replaced the Door of Hope buildings.

The upcoming OBHS program will be especially relevant to anybody who may have been born in Collier Park Hospital and later adopted from the Door of Hope, or anybody who worked there during its 55-year run. Activists who helped save Collier Park west from further development are also encouraged to come and share their stories.

Because many peninsula residents were born at this Ocean Beach Door of Hope and have expressed an interest in our website to learn more about it, OBHS will be having a "Collier Park Picnic Event", where people will have an opportunity to share their stories, photos and memories while enjoying a day in the historic Collier Park west. 



The Girls Home Door of Hope Association, No 77, sometimes known as Door of Hope, and also known as the Girl's Home of San Diego, California, for and in consideration of the sum of \$1.00 and other valuable considerations, does hereby quit-claim, remise and convey to the Salvation Army, Incorporated, the following described personal property, to-wit:

All furnishing, good-will, fixtures, appurtenances, together with the building now belonging to the Grantors, located on Pueblo Lot No. 206 Ocean Beach. San Diego, California, and known as The Door of Hope, together with all income legassees, bequests, trust funds, and other moneys now belonging to the Grantors.

This conveyance is made in pursuance of the resolution of the Board of Directors of said Corporation, passed March 11th 1930, to which resolution

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above described personal property. IN WITNESS WHEREOF said Corporation has hereunto set its hand and seal by its proper officers, this 12th day of January, 1931.


Ocean Beach Historical Society on YouTube
